

Advance Notice - National Shoebox Collection Week - 14 to 21 November

The pandemic and the various conflicts around the world continue to cause additional challenges for many families in countries overseas and your Gifts of Love packed in a Shoebox are more vital than ever. Will you pack a Shoebox and send Good News and Great Joy to thousands of children who at Christmas would otherwise receive no presents?

The school-room at Monkhill Chapel is a drop-off point for the appeal during November. Shoeboxes (flat packed and ready for assembly and filling and do not need wrapping) can be provided by us and are preferred, as 20 of these shoeboxes of a standard size fit into the large cardboard containers for onward transmission to a regional centre for checking. It is also possible to donate on-line and you can put together a complete shoebox on-line too if preferred. Further details will be provided next month.

Rectory Ramblings

Meanings matter, what we call things reflects our history, our understanding, and our intent. We're about to have a new leader (practically speaking) of the United Kingdom. But have you thought about what their title is? Rather than being an Emperor, a Grand Vizier, or a President, denoting their own power we have a 'Prime Minister'. They may be the most powerful person in the country, but they are a 'Minister' meaning someone who serves others (rather than themselves). God calls us to pray for them to do that well (Romans 13:1-7, 1 Timothy 2:1-2), and let's keep them accountable to their role!

While we're not a Christian country, our culture is inescapably shaped by Christendom [a highly recommended book on this is 'Dominion' by Tom Holland] including naming our leader as one who serves us, following in the steps of Jesus the King of Kings who said:

'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them...But <u>you</u> <u>are not to be like that</u>. Instead, the greatest among you should be like the youngest, and <u>the one who rules like the one who serves</u>... <u>I am among you</u> as one who serves. Luke 22:25-27

That is why on our church website you'll see that my email address is minister@... rather than priest@... because a priest is someone who opens access between humans and God, and (whilst I love to help people meet Jesus) I am not needed for that. Similarly in my communicating (written or spoken) you'll hear me speak of St Michael's or St Giles' etc. as 'church buildings' not 'churches' because the church is the locally gathering family of God, not the venue built for them to meet in. And I'll say 'Communion Table' not 'Altar' ... [etc.]

This month why not be inquisitive, looking at the familiar with a questioning mind, asking 'why is it called that?' 'What was intended by that?' 'Is that meaning still being worked out in practice?' Then ponder the titles of God - our <u>Father</u> in Heaven, <u>Lord</u> Jesus, <u>Holy</u> Spirit... and consider how you are receiving (and responding to) their wonderful meanings:

Our Churchwardens who ably managed their local church family and church building matters, and Carolyne Baines who kindly handled cross parish and complex matters.

I do hope that you have had some time for refreshment and renewal this summer ... and I look forward to seeing you soon, getting to know and praise Him who gives us all good things, and is the source of the deepest peace and rest, now and forever – our Lord Jesus ©




